**TO THE ATTENTION OF THE NATIONAL CORRESPONDENTS OF BULGARIA,
CROATIA, CYPRUS, FRANCE, GREECE, ITALY, MALTA, ROMANIA,
SLOVENIA, AND SPAIN**

Subject: 2020 Official call for data on landings, discards, length and age compositions, biological parameters, trawl and hydro acoustic surveys in the Mediterranean and in the Black Sea.

Dear Sir/Madam,

The European Union is expected to establish multi-annual plans for relevant Mediterranean fisheries catching demersal and small pelagic species, in particular, in areas totally or partially beyond the territorial waters of Member States (Council Regulation (EC) N° 1380/2013¹). Moreover, the promotion of improved scientific advice on the status of the main stocks in the Black Sea and on the fisheries exploiting these stocks is of outmost importance for the implementation of the Common Fisheries Policy in this particular region. The scientific basis of these plans and the status of the different stocks shall come from an analysis carried out by scientists of EU Member States both at EU and national level as well as within the Scientific Advisory Committee of the General Fisheries Commission for the Mediterranean (GFCM-SAC).

With a view to further support the scientific community in the Mediterranean and in the Black Sea, the European Commission has given mandate to its Scientific, Technical and Economic Committee for Fisheries (STECF) to adopt an operational work-programme in order to update the knowledge on the status of the exploited demersal and small pelagic stocks. One of the main tasks within this work-programme is to evaluate the exploitation levels with respect to their biological and economic productivity and the sustainability of the exploited stocks. It is intended to achieve this task by using both trawl and echo surveys as well as commercial landings/discards and fishing effort data as collected through the Community Data Collection programmes and adopted Work Plans (Regulation (EU) N° 1004/2017², Commission Decision 1251/2016³, Commission

Decision 1701/2016⁴), as well as other suitable scientific information collected through national and community funded studies and research projects, as well as regional projects such as CopeMed, MedSudMed, Adriamed or EastMed.

Since the launching of the STECF activities in 2008, more than thirty EWGs (<http://stecf.jrc.ec.europa.eu/reports/medbs>) have already taken place, which have contributed to further analyze the available information and provide light on the biological state of the main Mediterranean and Black Sea stocks.

In 2020, the STECF-EWGs and its scientists from all EU Mediterranean and Black Sea countries are expected to continue carrying out joint assessments, using different methods and data sources, on several stocks of important demersal and small pelagic species. The full list of species for which STECF is expected to carry out assessments and whose data must be uploaded as provided in ANNEX 1, Appendix 1.7.

Following a similar approach as that implemented in previous years, the European Commission herewith asks Member States to provide, as soon as possible and **not later than**:

- **25th June 2020 (midday)**, fisheries and surveys data in support of the forthcoming STECF EWG 20-09⁵ and EWG 20-15⁶ on Mediterranean stock assessments (parts I and II). This request shall apply to all Member States. Requested data are in detail:
 - **Fisheries data** (catches, landings, discards) shall be submitted in accordance to Appendix 1 and 2 of ANNEX 1 and for the **year 2019**;
 - **Biological data** (Maturity ogives at Length, Maturity ogives at Age, Growth parameters, Sex ratio at length, Sex ratio at age, Age length key) shall be submitted in accordance with Appendix 3 of ANNEX 1 and for the **full time series**;
 - **Scientific survey data (MEDITS, SOLEMON, Black Sea surveys** or other survey data if format is in compliance with the MEDITS ones (TA,TB and TC)) shall be submitted in accordance with Appendix 4.1 of ANNEX 1 and for the year 2019;
 - **Scientific survey data** collected under different surveys (e.g. **MEDIAS**) shall be submitted in accordance with Appendix 4.2 of ANNEX 1 and for the **year 2019**.

The JRC Data Upload portlet will officially open for submissions on the **25th May 2020**.

According to data-handling procedure for STECF Expert Working Groups an **operational deadline will be set on the 24^h of July 2020 (open 20th to 24th midday)**

Detailed information on the working procedures in respect to the deadlines can be traced in ANNEX 2 (*Data-handling procedure for STECF Expert Working Groups*)

To comply with the outcome of the EWG 18-11⁷ the codes reported in ANNEX 1 (Appendix 1-9) were revised. Specifically: country code for Romania and Bulgaria, fisheries codes, gear code and area code.

Moreover, MEDITS files format have been **updated according to MEDITS Handbook Version 9 2017**. In particular, to give the opportunity to the Member State to upload salinity information some columns were added to the TA file. Furthermore, a new column was added in all the three files in which name of the survey should be reported. This entry gives the opportunity to upload survey information collected during other surveys but MEDITS (e.g SOLEMON or Black Sea demersal survey) if these data will be provided according to the MEDITS format.

We remind Member States that according to ANNEX 1 – Appendix 1.9 they must provide landings and discards (if available) in weight by species both for métier selected and for métier not selected by the ranking system.

If MS decide to revise and resubmit the data time series, a justification must be requested to DGMARE Unit D1 (contact Christos.Maravelias@ec.europa.eu) and Unit C3 (contact venetia.kostopoulou@ec.europa.eu) to gain overwrite/append rights.

To improve data transmission and quality checking, in 2016 the JRC portlet has been changed along with the digital format of the files and the implementation of a file naming convention. Files will be requested as Comma Separated Values (.csv) and only one file for each table will be accepted at upload. Full details of the data transmission procedures are detailed in ANNEX 3.

Scientific experts will be invited to attend the forthcoming STECF EWGs and whenever considered advisable, DG MARE will contact the National Correspondents during the STECF EWGs for any needed/ additional data sets, by GFCM-GSA concerned,. Any use of data different from those uploaded by Member States, as part of this data call, will be duly justified and recorded in the STECF EWG report.

The European Commission reminds Member States that according to Article 17 of Regulation (EU) No 1004/2017, Member States must make detailed and aggregated data available to end-users to support scientific analysis as a basis for fisheries management.

Member States shall take note of the **Data Validation Tool** (provided by DG JRC and available from <https://dcallnet.jrc.ec.europa.eu/web/dcf/dvt/medbs>) and are encouraged to use it in order to avoid errors at upload time to the JRC portlet, to support the data submissions and enhance the data quality.
